

During the last term of 2008, the College community developed a Vision Statement, which is about striving for excellence in all we do. It will help us navigate a clear path through the many changes occurring in education and ensure that our decision making is aligned with offering each member the *"opportunity to grow and mature to his or her full potential and live as a valued and contributing member of our ever changing society"*. The opening statement, quoted above, makes it clear that central to all we do is our aim to be a Christ centred community in the tradition of the Marist and Mercy orders who over the last 150 years founded schools around the world.

We are called to actively support the College's mission of the work of the Catholic Church. Some wonderful examples in 2008 have been the ongoing development of REMAR, a Marist based youth ministry group, the well prepared liturgies, the generosity of students in their community service work and participation of staff and students in the journey of the World Youth Day Cross and Icon and World Youth Day activities.

The year began sadly with the deaths of two members of our community, Year 8 student Phoebe Troughton and staff member, Kerry Smith. Phoebe was a bright student and talented young sports person who we knew as a gentle, happy and caring person. Mr Kerry Smith, MDT assistant, also died suddenly and is remembered as a loyal and dedicated employee who enjoyed most of all working with students on their wood and metal projects. In February, Mrs Christine Andrews, who had retired 9 months earlier, died after a relatively short illness. As these events occurred we came to a new appreciation of the gift of life and to appreciate the importance of meaningful relationships, self-care and care for those we are called to serve. We remember the gifts Phoebe, Kerry and Christine shared with us and give thanks for the life that God gave to them and has given to us.

There were many highlights in 2008 which remind us that our staff and students often "strive for excellence". The following is a small selection:

- Students and staff participated in the National AMSA netball and basketball carnivals, with particular success enjoyed by the boy's basketball team in Cairns
- In July the College community presented the musical, *Grease*, to sell out audiences totalling nearly 3,000 people. It was a superb show which gave participating students a great sense of achievement and confidence.
- 15 students and 2 staff travelled to Japan and visited our sister school Kochi Minami High School
- 6 students and 2 staff travelled to Sweden to receive their prize for the Linnaeus School Challenge which was won in 2007
- Storm Holwill won the National BHP Billiton Science Prize and travelled to Atlanta Georgia to the Intel Science and Engineering Fair where she was placed 3rd in the Energy and Transportation Section.
- Business Studies students and Mrs Louise Thynne developed a database and in conjunction with The Advocate and the Burnie City Council launched the Burnie Business Directory, a wonderful example of "hands on" learning making a practical contribution to the wider community.

The College farewells Mrs Dillys Goninon, Maths (and Geology) teacher, who has served the College for 31 years with great distinction. Her insistence on high standards of behaviour and study and her love of young people will be remembered. We also wish other members of staff who are leaving all the best.

Membership

The Board members were joined in meetings by Mr Les Allen & Mr Richard Lakeland.

Master Plan

Contractors installed & commissioned the lift to complete the Conway Hall redevelopment project.

Architects and the Board are currently reviewing the College's Master Plan to help us identify and cost priorities in developing the College for the future. We see significant issues with the age and design of some of our classroom areas, while increasing enrolments continue to place pressure on availability of rooms.

The challenge of Middle Schooling will require a significant building program in the near future.

Refurbishment of staff office space in the main staff room and other areas will be carried out over the summer to be completed in readiness for the 2009 school year.

A long overdue replacement of the ground keeper's shed was completed this year.

Finance

The Board has continued to lobby the Grants Allocation Committee for a greater allocation of Federal Government funding in order to gain the funding required to continue to develop the College.

Close cooperation of the Finance Committee and the Business Manager has seen the College produce another good budgetary result for 2008.

The Budget has been prepared for 2009 with the Federal remote funding allowing a balanced budget totalling \$9.48 million (up from \$8.85 million in 2008).

Fee increases have been kept under 5% while labour costs are predicted to rise by 7%.

Other Matters

The safety fence on the school exit road identified in last year's report was completed early this year.

The Board has worked with the Business Manager and the Governing Council representative on the un-incorporation of Marist Regional College and this is now complete.

Finally I would like to thank fellow board members, the Parents & Friends, College Staff and students for their collective efforts in taking Marist Regional College forward in all aspects of its development. We can all see the improvements in the College's physical assets but it is in improving the learning and development of our students, in increasing numbers, that we can all take pride.

TEACHING AND LEARNING

There have been many learning and teaching highlights throughout 2008, and it is inspirational to see the breadth and diversity of what occurs daily (including weekends) both within and around our classrooms in the modern day learning environment. More and more 'virtual' learning or learning in a digital way is becoming the norm and the College is embracing the need to expand its teaching and learning strategies to embrace the digital ways that our students can cope with connecting, not only with each other, but with other peers across the state, nation and world.

In 2008 we continue to keep literacy, numeracy and pastoral development at the core of our curriculum, and the nationwide testing for literacy and numeracy that was conducted for Year 7 and Year 9 students for the first time in 2008 revealed some important trends for our literacy and numeracy teaching and learning. We have value added our students' literacy and numeracy skills in 2008, as evidenced by the data in both Year 7 2008 and from Year 7 2006 data, for our current Year 9 students.

The data reveals that the College's benchmark results are strongest in numeracy. To strategically improve and track literacy development over time, a middle school (Years 7 and 8) literacy program (L.E.A.P – Literacy Enhancement Achievement Program) will be undertaken by all Year 7 and Year 8 students, in a vertically timetabled structure in 2009. This program is being conducted in schools across Tasmania, and students have shown great success in their literacy development and capacity building throughout the program.

Daily extra and co curricular activities reveal the many talents and skills of our students. These include entry and successes in many regional, national and international subject based competitions and the many excursions and out of class learning experiences that students have the opportunity to experience at the College.

Challenging our preferred talents and expanding our skills is never easy, however, the quest for knowledge and continuously renewing our learning and teaching practices lay at the foundation of our academic, social and cultural successes.

The continued tracking of our students and their employability skills for the future reveal that our students have a well balanced approach to their chosen careers, whether they be in the traditional trades, emerging trade areas, university, certificate courses or employment. A rigorous academic program coupled with our strong pastoral support breeds success and a climate of respectful and calculated risk taking in our graduates. I extend a warm and heartfelt thank you to all teaching and non-teaching staff for their dedication and witness to our young people throughout 2008, and I look forward to another rewarding 2009.

Governing Council Report

It is again my pleasure as your Archbishop and Chairman of the Marist Regional College Governing Council to present this report to the College community.

I thought it might be appropriate to take this opportunity to give some clarity around the governance and the associated responsibilities in the governance process.

College Governance:

The governance of the College was formulated by the adoption of the Marist Regional College Constitution on the 14th March 2007. As Archbishop of Hobart I authorize the existence of all Catholic Education institutions in Tasmania. For Marist Regional College, as for all of the Archdiocesan Colleges, the ultimate authority for the conduct of the College rests with the Roman Catholic Church Trust Corporation of the Archdiocese of Hobart (Church Trust Corporation), acting by delegated authority through the appointed Governing Council. The Governing Council conducts the College in collegial partnership with the Board and the College Principal.

Governance responsibilities are defined in the College Constitution, but are listed here in a concise format:

Governing Council:

The Governing Council supports, monitors and guides the Board and the Principal in the exercise of their duties as set out. The Governing Council retains the overall authority for the management of the College notwithstanding delegation to the Board and the Principal.

The Governing Council is particularly responsible for:

- on behalf of the Church Trust Corporation employing all staff;
- appointing the Principal;
- confirming senior appointments;
- arranging the Principal's appraisal;
- being the final body of referral in any unresolved matters under the grievance process;
- managing any critical issues;
- after consideration, deciding on major changes to the College;
- giving final approval of appointments to the Board;
- giving final endorsement to the appointment of Board Chairman; and
- communicating to the appropriate bodies the decisions of the Governing Council.

Board:

The Board is responsible to the Governing Council and in particular will:

- in consultation with staff, parents, students and within the broad parameters established by the Governing Council formulate policy;
- maintain the College as an institute of Catholic education;
- consult with the Governing Council with regards to major changes;
- liaise with the Parish Priests and Parish Pastoral Councils;
- develop and implement strategic and financial plans and building programs;
- manage the College finances; and
- communicate promptly and effectively with the Governing Council.

Principal:

The Principal in accordance with the policies of the Governing Council and the Board (regarding financial matters) is directly responsible for the overall leadership and management of the College and, in particular, will:

- develop a faith community;
- implement policies and decisions of the Archdiocese, TCEC, Governing Council and the Board;
- developing, interpreting and implementing policy for the welfare of the College;
- educational leadership and administration of the College;
- as the agent of the Governing Council for the engagement, management and supervision of all staff;
- arrange the engagement of senior leadership personnel in the College, subject to the endorsement of the Governing Council;
- discern and implement strategic priorities;
- enroll students within the guidelines set by the TCEC, the Governing Council and the Board;
- establish and improvise the pastoral and educational standards of the College;
- manage public relations;
- administer the finances within the approved annual budget;
- provide regular reports to the Governing Council and the Board; and
- fulfill all legal, industrial, compliance and accountability requirements.

The Governing Council draws its membership from the College community and is the delegated authority of the Roman Catholic Trust Corporation of the Archdiocese of Hobart.

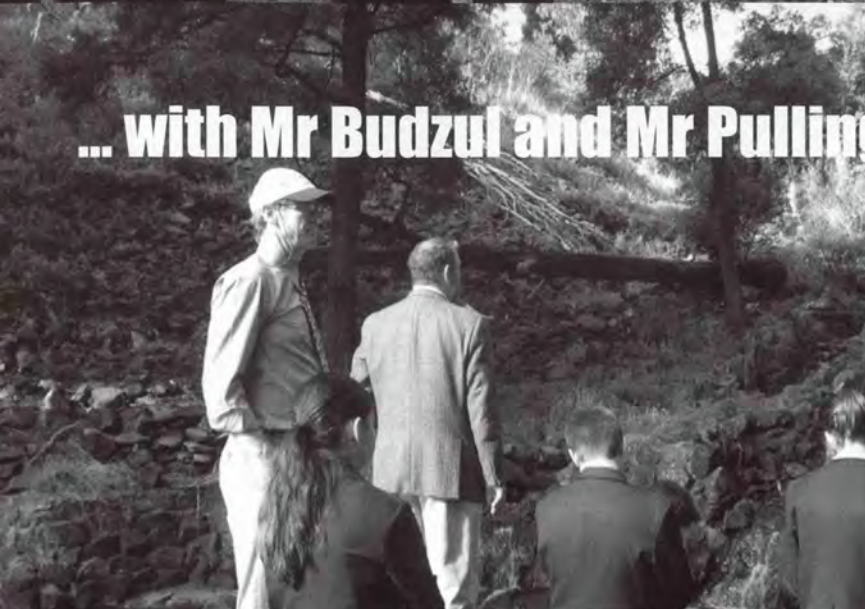

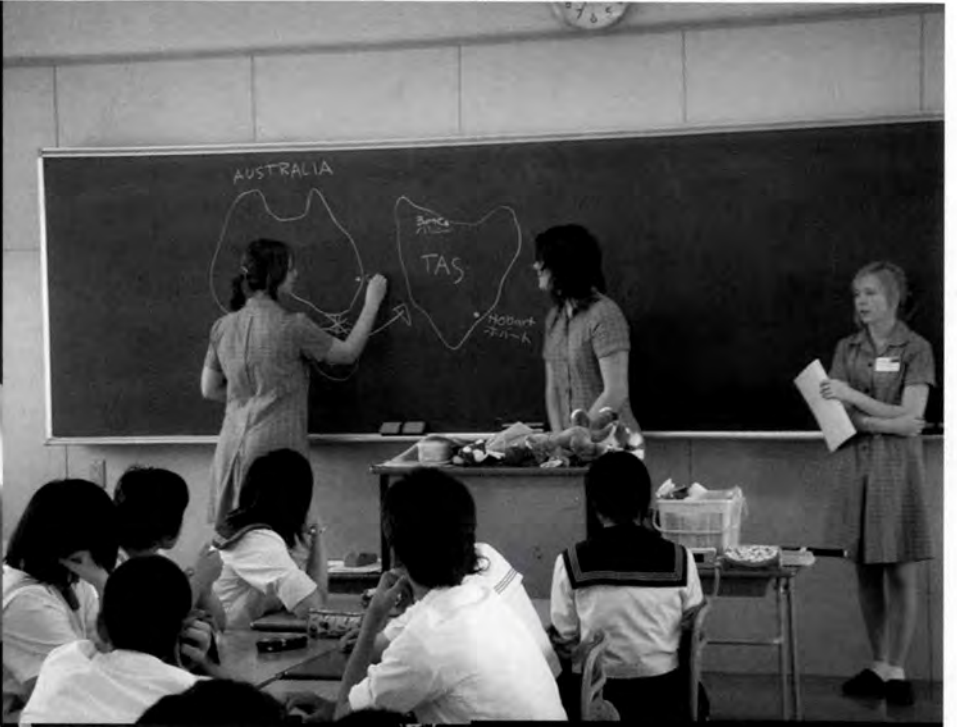

These are just a few of the exciting new work experience placements developed this year.

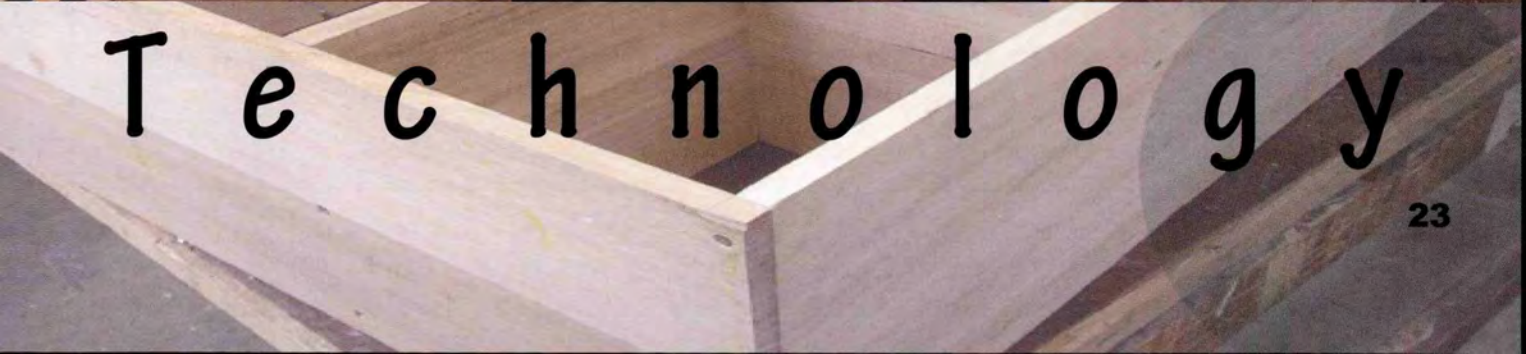

Science

2008 was an exciting year for the Science Faculty at MRC. We saw some students achieve outstanding success in an international competition coordinated by the Swedish Institutes resulting in six students travelling to Sweden as part of their prize. Success was also achieved at the BHP-Billiton Research Awards, the University of NSW Sustainable Living Challenge and the Tasmanian Science Talent Search. This success is all due to the hard work and dedication of Ms. Ann Burke who has given countless hours outside of normal lesson times to enable these students to experience this success.

At the beginning of 2008 we welcomed Dr. Michael Hanson, Ms Renee French, Mr. Xavier Williams, Mr. Ian Margetts and Mr. Peter Pullinger into the Science team while Ms. Burke took some well earned long service leave. Dr. Hanson left us at the end of Term 1 as we welcomed Ms. Burke back at the same time. Later in the year, Mr. Pullinger took some leave, Mr Wayne Gale joined the team. Ms. Anita Duraj, our laboratory technician, also commenced education studies and taught a number of Science classes in Term 3. A large change of staff can have an unsettling effect; however, all of these teachers are to be congratulated on their professionalism in the way they conduct their classes, making any transition smooth and with as little interruption for the students as possible.

We farewell Mr. Andrew Mitchell who moves to Melbourne to continue his teaching career. His professional manner, deep knowledge of Science and related issues and willingness to contribute at all times to matters in relation to teaching Science at MRC will be missed. We wish Mr. Mitchell all the best in his move. 2009 will see a continuation of the development of the Science Curriculum at MRC. Approval has been granted to develop a greenhouse facility to enhance any courses that benefit from the growing of plants, from Year 7 through to Senior College Biology and Life Science classes. As well, students studying Science at a Strand 2 level in Year 9 and 10 will have access to a parallel syllabus. Currently all students have been studying the same syllabus for the past two years.

We look forward to an exciting year in 2009 as staff office facilities are renovated in the Sir Robert Menzies Science Block, allowing Science staff the opportunity to operate together out of one facility.

National Youth Science Forum (NYSF)

During 2008 Nathan House (Year 11) won a place at the National Youth Science Forum to be held in Canberra during January, 2009. Three of our students, Nathan

House, Phoebe Lillas and Claire Powell (all Year 11) were successful in making the state interview stage of the National Youth Science Forum with Nathan winning a place at NYSF to be held in Canberra during January 2009. During the year 2008 the Swedish nation celebrated the tercentenary of the birth of Carl Linnaeus (1707-1778) and to celebrate this significant date, The Great Linnaean School Challenge was announced. It offered the trip of a lifetime – a study visit to Swedish Lapland, the last wilderness in Europe.

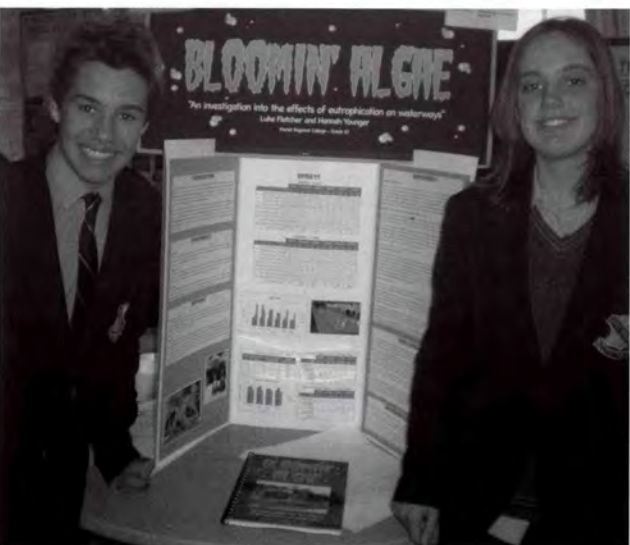
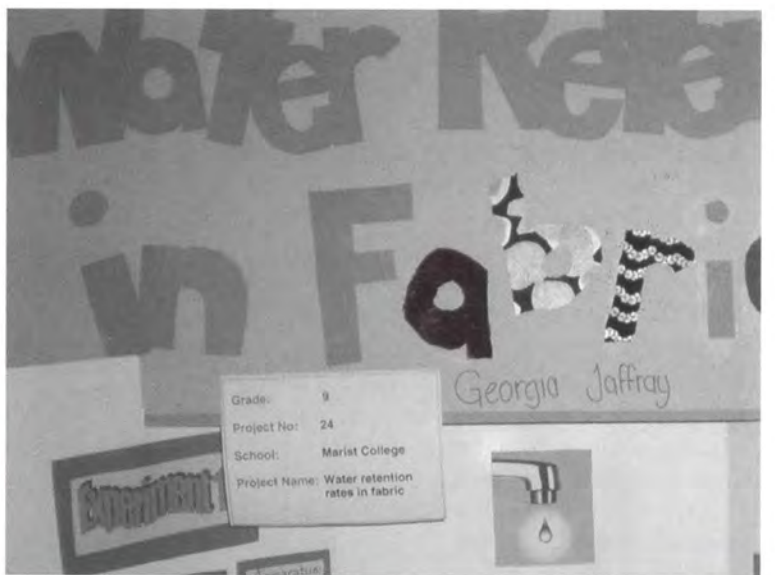
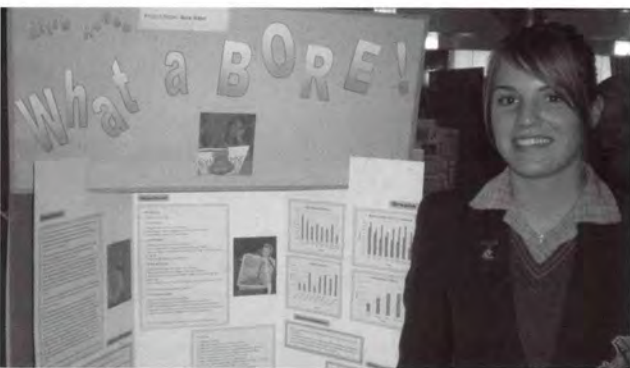
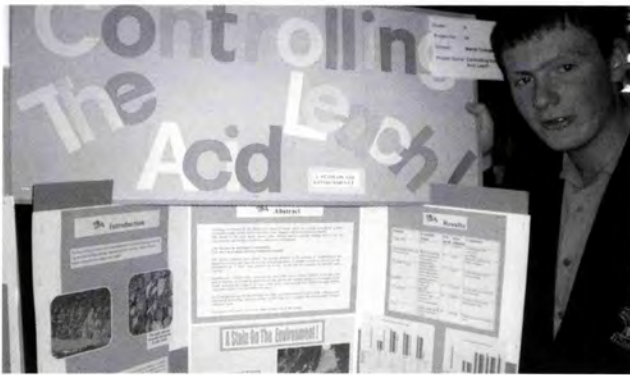

We have introduced new courses of study in Years 9 and 10 and these have proved popular with many of the students. Mathematics Relay Competition

On Sunday August 10, eight students, representing Marist, made up two teams of four to compete in the Tasmanian Mathematics Association Annual Relay Competition. In the relay, one student acts as the runner for the team, while the others attempt to solve a problem. With each new question, team members rotate position, so that a new student becomes the runner. Teams have a maximum of 45 minutes to solve 20 questions.

Our team of Year 10 students Luke Fletcher, Gabrielle Hay, Storm Holwill and Hannah Younger won the Intermediate section of the Competition for the North West Coast. However Southern Schools proved too strong and took out the Competition for this age group. Our Year 7 and 8 team of Savannah Holwill, Isobel Johnson, Madeline Ryan-Hodgetts and Madeline

Younger did well and gained valuable experience for next year.

Australian Mathematics Competition

A total of 170 students from Year 7 to Year 12 entered this year's Australian Mathematics Competition. Approximately 70 students were entered in Year 7 and Year 8 and students from higher grades entered individually if they wished. It was disappointing to see a decrease in the number of students entering the Competition from Years 9-12. However, it was very pleasing to see the high standard of results achieved by those who did enter.

Three students received High Distinction Certificates: Dylan Cowgill (Year 7), Savannah Holwill (Year 8), and Benjamin House (Year 9).

A Prudence Certificate is awarded to the student in the school who answers the greatest number of consecutive questions correctly. Year 8 student, Savannah Holwill received this award for 2008, and should be congratulated on receiving this certificate and also for being placed within the 100th percentile for her year.

NAPLAN TESTING

In May, students across Australia in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sat the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) Testing. Approximately 25,000 students from Tasmanian government and non-government schools participated.

In reviewing the Numeracy results for our College, my reaction was one of pleasure in noting how our students had performed and that our students had compared favourably to the rest of Tasmania and, in fact, Australia as a whole.

IN NUMERACY

Year 7 students were 99% at or above the National Minimum Standard compared to 95% for Tasmania and 95% for Australia.

Year 9 students were 99% at or above the National Minimum Standard compared to 92% for Tasmania and 94% for Australia

Closer inspection of the School Summary Report illustrates a few other points:

1. In Year 9, 14% of our students reached the top band (Band 10) compared to 8% Australia wide. However, in Year 7, 10% of our students reached the top band (Band 9) compared to 12% Australia wide.
2. 67% of our students in Year 9 are in the top 3

- bands, compared to 47% Australia wide.
3. 63% of our students in Year 7 are in the top 3 bands, compared to 55% Australia wide.

The students and our Mathematics teachers and support staff must be congratulated on receiving such fine results.

Finally, congratulations to all students who have participated enthusiastically in the College Mathematics programme this year, and also to the parents who have supported them in their learning.

VET: Hospitality and Trades





As always, we've been very busy in the Resource Centre. I know I say this every year, however during 2008 we've had about 135 000 people through the Library doors, more than any other year since we began counting. While they were visiting us, students and staff borrowed about 35 000 items. Laptops in particular have been in very high demand. Nevertheless books and other resources are still being heavily borrowed, as well as being used within the Library. This year is the first time we've allowed students to borrow DVDs for overnight viewing which seems to have been an idea students approved of, particularly the Grade 7s and 8s. Another first is allowing students to borrow books over the 2008/09 Christmas holidays which we decided to trial this year because of the lack of shelf space.

We've worked hard at enticing students to visit us throughout 2008, adding quite a few extras such as a suggestion book used to request new resources or suggest new innovations; and a fortnightly quiz they could enter for a chance to win a prize. We've also introduced 'Brain Food', where we provided afternoon tea (biscuits, popcorn and cordial) to students studying in the Library at 3.30 on Thursday afternoons. This idea was very successful with sizable numbers of students making the Library their place of choice, particularly at the end of the year when portfolios were due and exams needed to be studied for.

As mentioned before, we have been running a regular fortnightly quiz throughout the year, awarding the prize of a cinema ticket to the lucky winner every second Friday. We also ran a major competition throughout Term 3 to encourage students to borrow fiction. Students who borrowed any of the 101 'Reasons to Read a Book' books went into a draw to win five cinema tickets. We also awarded a prize to the person who'd borrowed the most number of competition

books. I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate all of the year's competition winners, and thank everyone who entered. During Term 2 Marist Regional College hosted two authors - Michael Gerard Bauer and Anthony Eaton. Jointly organised by Library staff and the English Co-ordinator, Mrs Bessell, Michael and Anthony spoke to almost the entire school, either as a year group discussing how they got into writing and their lives, or as a practical lesson in how to write effectively for those fortunate Senior College students studying English. Their talks were informative as well as very entertaining; and although it was a very hectic time for the Library and English staff, we felt it was definitely worthwhile with very positive comments from all involved.

The Resource Centre staff has had a great deal of contact with the 2008 Grade 7 students, both in and out of class time. Each class group came to the Library one period a week for different lessons, some taken by me and some by their regular teacher with Library staff available to assist with finding information or a good book to read. We began the year with an introduction to the Library, and went on to learn how to use the Dewey decimal system and the Library catalogue, as well as how to start researching for an assignment. I did a lot of fiction recommendations for them to read during their English lessons and also assisted in their Literature Circle classes at times. Out of class time, we had quite a number of Year 7s as TFC members, and many came regularly to the Library during both recess and lunch to play games, read and study. It has been great to get to know these students and we plan to continue this contact in different ways throughout their school life.

The Teenage Fiction Club (TFC) has been quite active throughout 2008, although sadly numbers declined dramatically toward the end of the year. We have done a number

of new activities this year including visiting Angus & Robertson in Burnie to purchase books, meeting author Anthony Eaton and debating the quality of Matthew Reilly novels. Of course, we've also done all the usual things like going to the cinema together, recommending our favourite books and movies, and having a couple of really great movie/pizza evenings.

The Marist staff's reading group has also had a great year with some very interesting meetings discussing such books as *Bel Canto* by Ann Patchett (highly recommended by 2007's visiting author Justin D'Ath); *The Memory Keeper's Daughter* by Kim Edwards; *Peace Like a River* by Leif Enger; *Across the Nightingale Floor* by Lian Hearn and *Pomegranate Soup* by Marsha Mehran. As a group we highly recommend that everyone try to read *The Book Thief* by Marcus Zuzak; *The Guernsey Literary and Potato Peel Society* by Mary Ann Shaffer, *The Running Man* by Michael Gerard Bauer and *Garden Spells* by Sarah Addison Allen.

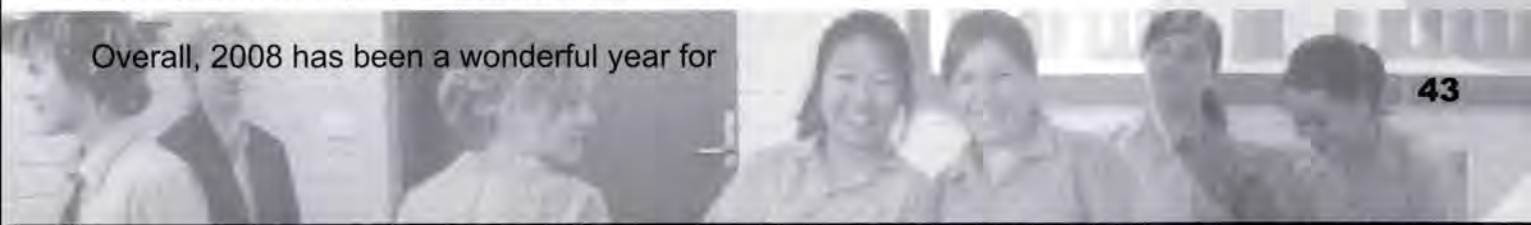

On behalf of the team, I would like to thank the College for their support and their help in making this trip a reality, Mr Pearson for coaching and the boys for their enthusiasm and effort.

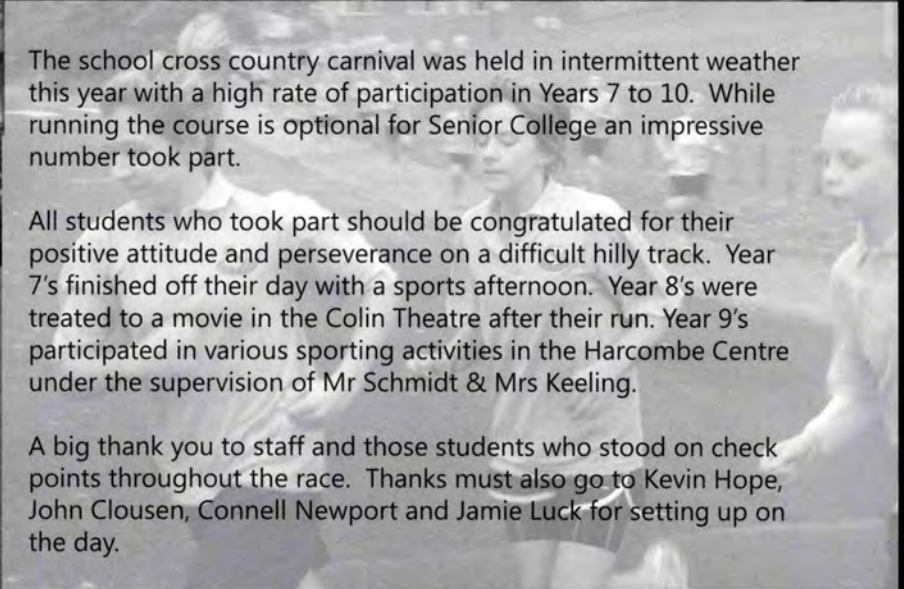
