

Year 10 Introduction to Automotive

What will I gain from completing this short skill set?

Do you enjoy getting your hands dirty, working on machinery and wondering how engines work? This course provides students with fun, practical handson learning and knowledge about a wide range of areas associated with the automotive industry. This taster course will include three (3) nationally accredited VET units of competency, which may go towards the Tasmanian Certificate of Education (TCE), if the student is deemed competent in each unit. Students may choose to enrol in the full qualification in AUR10120 Certificate I in Automotive Vocational Preparation in their Senior College years (subject to change).

- AURAEA001 Identify environmental and sustainability requirements in an automotive service and repair workplace
- AURASA001 Apply automotive workplace safety fundamentals
- AURTTK102 Use and maintain tools and equipment in an automotive workplace
- AURTTE003 Remove and tag engine system components

Delivery time-frame:

Over 1 year.

What will I learn?

- Identify environmental and sustainability requirements in an automotive service or repair workplace.
- Gain an understanding of hazards in the environment from the service and repair of vehicles, as well as identifying sustainability practices that may reduce the environmental impact of work practices and outputs.
- Apply automotive workplace safety fundamentals and prepare, identify basic workplace emergency and safety practices and procedures.

Safety requirements:

Safety glasses are supplied by the College. Safety boots are required for practical workshop lessons.

Pre-requisites:

Interviews will form part of the enrolment and selection process.
